COLOSSIANS: A Study by Bill Jones "The Foundation of our Faith: Standing Firm"

(Colossians 1:24-2:23)

In chapter 2 Paul addresses four false teachings that were creeping into the Colossians church:

Four infiltrating doctrines:

- 1. Philosophy
- 2. Legalism or ritualism
- 3. Mysticism
- 4. Asceticism

Paul is showing them something better than the false teachings. He is sharing Godly truth with them.

- I. Paul's Proclamation of the Gospel—A labor of love
 - A. His commitment/perseverance: Joy in suffering for the Church as did Christ

(Colossians 1:24, 2:1)

B. His message/proclamation: Riches of the mystery of God which is Christ in us.

(Colossians 1:25-27, 2:2-3)

That we may know the wisdom and knowledge found in Christ by being:

- 1. Encouraged in heart
- 2. United in love
- 3. Full of the riches of complete understanding of the mystery of Christ in us.

C. His goal/purpose: Perfection through Christ

if we accept the Gospel

(Colossians 1:28, 2:9-12)

- 1. To admonish (warn, reprove, convincing of error)
- 2. To teach (instruct in faith, believe and repent)
- 3. To apply (make practical, present everyone perfect in Christ)
- D. His source/power: Strength from Christ imparted by the Holy Spirit

(Colossians 1:29, 2:12)

- II. Paul's Living out the Gospel—An example to emulate (Colossians 2:1-3)
 - A. Real faith (Paul took Epaphras' concern upon himself)
 - B. Real concern for the saints (to be complete in Christ)
 - C. Real surrender to Christ (no matter the cost or suffering)
- III. Paul's Defending the Gospel Truth against false teachings (Colossians 2:4-23)
 - A. Philosophy—Don't be deceived by hollow, good sounding arguments (v8)

(Colossians 2:4-10)

- B. Legalism or Ritualism—Was nailed to the cross (v14)
 You have a new life in Christ, don't work for men's approval, following rules, worrying about what others think.
 Reality is found in Christ (v17).
 (Colossians 2:11-17)
- C. Mysticism—Man claimed visions that should worship angels because not good enough to worship God (v18)
 Paul calls this false humility or presumptuous pride which refuses God's only appointed way through Jesus Christ. (Colossians 2:18-19)
- D. Asceticism—Harsh treatment of the body and rules (v20-21) Rules don't work and don't make men better and give no victory over our sinful nature.

Only victory is through Christ. We need His strength and power, faith that works

(Colossians 2:20-23)

- E. Some philosophies that are infiltrating our world today
 - 1. Hedonism--Seeking pleasure
 - 2. Worldliness--Fitting in
 - 3. Me-ism—Looking out for number 1
 - 4. Self-negativism—Beating yourself up
