1 Kings 21

- I. Three truths about God's judgment:
 - A. Although God's mercies are great, there is an end to God's patience.

(Genesis 19:1-29, 2 Chronicles 36:11-16, Daniel 5, Acts 12:21-23, 2 Peter 3:9)

B. Although God's judgment does not always come quickly, it does come suddenly.

(Proverbs 29:1. Ecclesiastes 8:11)

C. Although God sometimes waits long in pronouncing judgment, once promised, it cannot be stopped.

(Proverbs 6:12-15, Revelation 21:5, 22:6)

II. Although God bestows many blessings, all we have belongs to God, and we are merely His tenants.

(1 Kings 21:3, Leviticus 25:10,13-17,23-28,34, Numbers 36:7-9, Ezekiel 46:16-18, Matthew 25:14-30)

III. Although God's law is perfect and good, wicked men and women will use it for their evil purposes.

(1 Kings 21:9-10, Exodus 22:28, Leviticus 24:14, Numbers 35:30, Deuteronomy 17:6, 19:15, Luke 4:9-12)

IV. Although we rationalize our sin so as to justify it, our sin will find us out.

(1 Kings 21:16, Numbers 32:23)

V. Although we obediently follow God, we can expect persecution and the cost is always our life either as living sacrifices or through physical death.

VI. Although sin has its fleeting pleasure, it also has its consequences.

(1 Kings 21:16-24)

A. Sin disturbs our peace.

B. Sin distorts our thinking.

C. Sin finally destroys everything.

VII. Although we speak the truth, we will often be hated for it.

(1 Kings 21:20)

VIII. Although God's judgments are sure, God honors and acknowledges humility.

(1 Kings 21:27-28, 2 Chronicles 7:14, 33:12-13, Psalm 51:17, Jeremiah 18:7-10, Joel 2:13, Luke 13:6-9)

IX. Although God's judgments are sometimes slow in coming, comparison and procrastination are dangerous responses.

(Joel 2:12-13, Matthew 7:21-23, 13:20-21, Luke 12:15-21, Acts 1:16-20, 8:9-24, 2 Corinthians 13:5, 2 Timothy 4:10, Hebrews 6:4-6, 10:26-39, 12:16-17, James 2:19, 2 Peter 1:10-11, 3:9, 1 John 2:18-19, 5:13)
